Arts and Humanities Medieval Presentation Requirements

Presenters Requirements

1. Presentation must be formally presented. This includes appropriate posture, appropriate and clear diction (speech), **NO** gum, and should be well-prepared/rehearsed. Your topic should be discussed thoroughly; we should learn from your presentation.

2. Presentation can be written on note cards or read from your typed paper.

3. Presentation must be **between** 3 and 5 minutes long. Must not be under and must not go over. 4. **One** visual aid is required for the presentation. This can be in the form of a poster, powerpoint (with pictures or charts), model, etc.- **printed pictures do not count, they must be displayed somehow.**

5. **One** activity is required for the presentation. This can be in the form of a quiz, crossword, word search, experiment, individual/class demonstration – be creative!

Audience Requirements

1. Audience members must be attentive (no sleeping or doing other class work).

2. Audience members must show respect to presenter. Examples include: listening and watching attentively, not talking, and not working on other work.

3. Audience members must write down one question to ask each presenter. Question must be of appropriate and intellectual content. These questions will be part of your personal presentation grade.

*Your presentation is worth **150 points** and your categories of grading will be Professionalism, Time, Speech/Diction, Visual Aid, Activity, and Audience.

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
